In April we saw Rachael Anders demonstrating her use of Caran d'Ache "Luminance" wax pencils and Faber Castell oil pencils with white Fabriano hot press smooth paper. Rachael confessed that she had only been doing this for a short time and this was her second demonstration. She proved to be very competent and shared lots of useful advice and tips whilst she made a careful observational drawing of a beautiful bumble bee.
